What is a Social Story™?

A Social Story™ uses storytelling to explain new experiences and environments, helpful for people feeling nervous about attending a new place or event.

- Read the social story two weeks before the visit.
- If reading to someone, help them understand key points.
- After the visit, re-read the social story to celebrate achievements.



I am going to the Western Shore's Dark Corners event. The meeting point is at Hall's Cottage on Leighton Place.

There are several event dates I can choose from:

- Friday, 27 September 7pm and 8pm.
- Saturday, 28 September 7pm and 8pm.





I may walk to the event from the Eastern Foreshore across the bridge.

I may travel to the event by bus. Bus stops are close by at Mary Street before Leighton Place.

I may travel by car, there is parking available on Leighton Place.

There are ACROD bays available in the Mandurah Bridge car park.





This is an interactive event that includes a 45-minute walk along the Western Foreshore in the dark.

The Western Foreshore has connecting pathways that are suitable for wheelchair users. There might be some short sections where I need to go on grass.





The event is suitable for a mature audience, there will be horror and supernatural themes in the stories told.

There might be sound effects, and someone might perform.

If I am under 15 years old, I will need an adult to come with me to the event.





I will listen to a story through headphones as part of a group, with a leader guiding us.

I will be given headphones to use during the event and will return them at the end.

I will hear historical stories, narrated by someone during the walk.





If I want to take a break from the story, I can remove the headphones. It's important to take good care of them.

When I'm ready, I can put the headphones back on to continue listening.

The story is being told in real time, so I won't be able to rewind it.





If I get tired and need a break, there are public seating options along the Western Foreshore.

The group will continue moving, and I can catch up with them when I'm ready.

I will try and stay with the group.





There will be toilets available near the skatepark at the Mandurah bridge.

There are two universal access toilets available.





Going to the Western Shore's Dark Corners event may be fun.
