Keep at least
0.5m clear
between bins

Keep at least
1m clear
from trees and not
under tree canopy

Keep at least
1m clear
of fences, cars,
letterboxes etc.



Place bins out by 6am
on your collection day



Maximum weight
of each bin is 70kg



Do not park in front of bins
and keep laneways clear

To ensure safe and efficient collection, place bins on the kerb with wheels facing your house, spaced apart, and free from obstructions.

This helps protect pedestrians, traffic, and collection crews.

Handy tips:

- Keep lids closed to prevent waste escaping
- Store bins in a shaded, secure location when not in use
- Place bins out for collection within 24 hours of pick-up and return once emptied
- Clean bins regularly to ensure they stay sanitary
- Report any damaged or missing bins

Recycle Right has a tool to help! Select the material, insert your location, and find your nearest drop off.

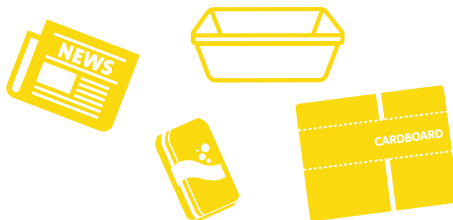

Recycling

Gift items to charity, swap or sell

Unwanted, reusable items such as clothes and toys in good condition can be gifted to charity, swapped, or sold.

You can find your nearest charity store or donation bin at **charitable recycling.org.au/find-op-shop**.

Note: If the donation bin is full, you can go into a store, call for home collection, or try another bin. Items left on the ground cannot be resold and become litter and end up in landfill.



Cleanaway will collect up to 5L of used engine waste oil and one car battery each fortnight.

Please place items at least 0.5m away from the recycling bin, ensuring they are clearly visible to the driver.

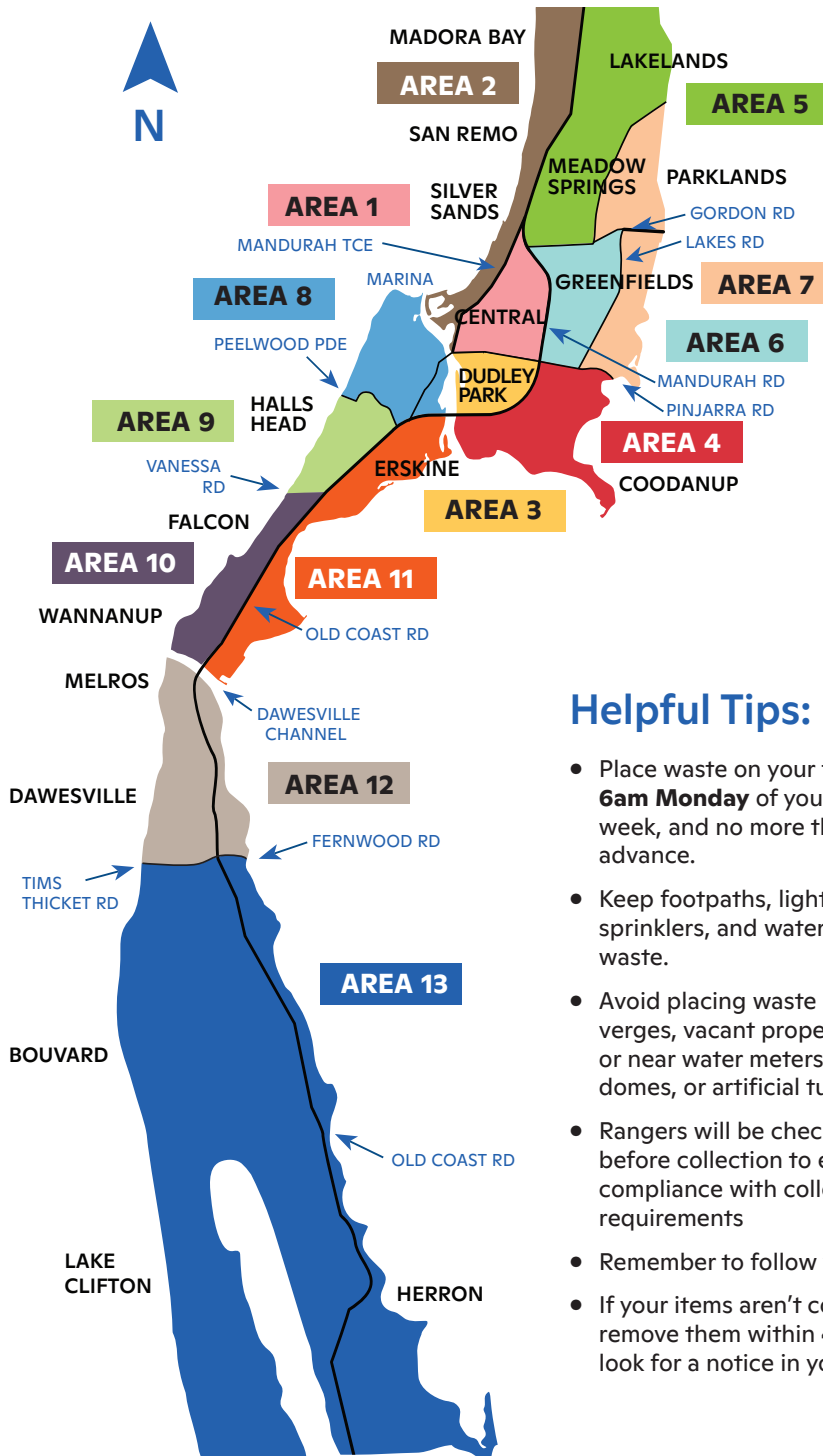

General Waste



Helpful Tips:

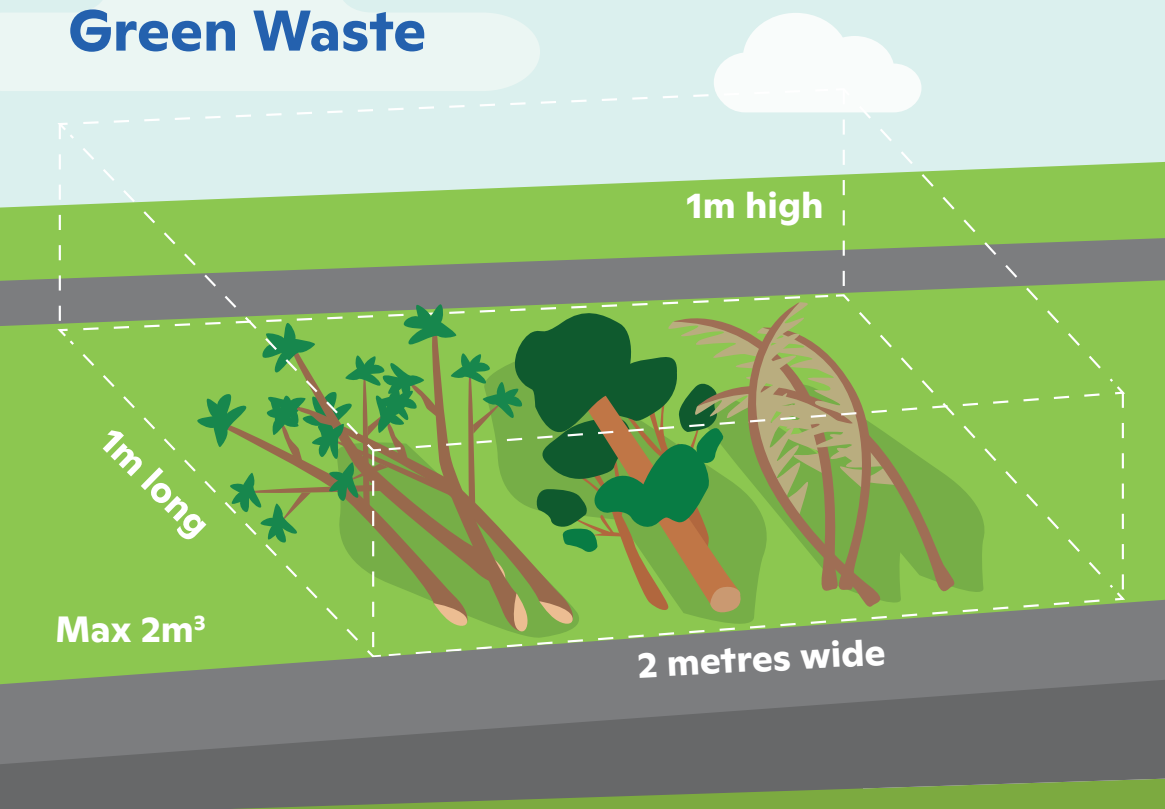
- Place waste on your front verge by **6am Monday** of your collection week, and no more than **7 days** in advance.
- Keep footpaths, light poles, trees, sprinklers, and water meters clear of waste.
- Avoid placing waste on other verges, vacant properties, reserves, or near water meters, electrical domes, or artificial turf.
- Rangers will be checking verges before collection to ensure compliance with collection requirements
- Remember to follow volume limits
- If your items aren't collected, please remove them within **48 hours** and look for a notice in your letterbox.

Green Waste



✓ What we collect

- Garden prunings
- Tree loppings (less than 1.5m length)
- Palm leaves
- Tree limbs, branches, and small logs (less than 1.5m in length and up to 300mm in diameter)

✗ What we don't collect

- Bags or boxes of green waste
- General rubbish or scrap metal
- Sand or soil materials
- Weeds and root materials
- Treated timber/pine
- Pallets
- Railway sleepers

Junk and Metals

Sort waste into three separate piles to help us recycle.

✓ What we collect

- General waste and junk
- White goods (doors must be removed)
- Furniture
- Scrap metal
- Timber products
- **Limit of two mattresses per household**

X What we don't collect

- Green waste
- E-Waste (batteries, laptops, computers, TVs)
- Building materials, asbestos, fibre cement
- Car bodies, parts, tyres, or batteries
- Household hazardous waste (paints, chemicals, fire extinguishers, gas cylinders)
- Large glass (mirrors, shower screens, table tops)
- Medical or veterinary waste
- Domestic rubbish or food waste
- Volumes greater than 3m³
- Solar panels



Never Bin a Battery

Batteries should never be placed in household bins as they can spark and cause dangerous fires in rubbish trucks and at waste facilities.

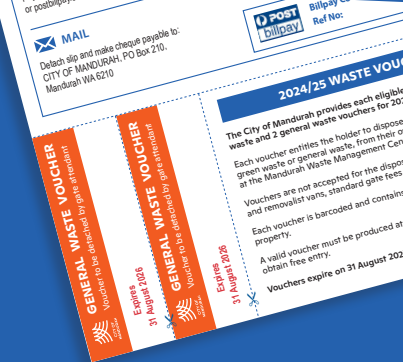
Waste Vouchers (tip passes)

Ratepayers are provided with 2x green waste and 2x general waste vouchers each year.

You'll find them attached to the bottom of your Rates Notice.

Please note: vouchers have an expiry date

Are you renting? Ask your agent for your vouchers!



Separate your load before visiting



CARDBOARD free of charge

Bulk cardboard (clean and flattened).



HAZARDOUS WASTE free of charge, limits apply

Gas bottles, paint, light globes/tubes, batteries, motor oil, smoke detectors, e-waste, aerosol cans, and household chemicals.



METAL WASTE free of charge

Scrap metal, white goods, fencing, sheet metal, car parts, bikes, and lawnmowers.



GREEN WASTE

Tree and shrub prunings, trunks up to 300mm diameter, grass clippings, and leaves.



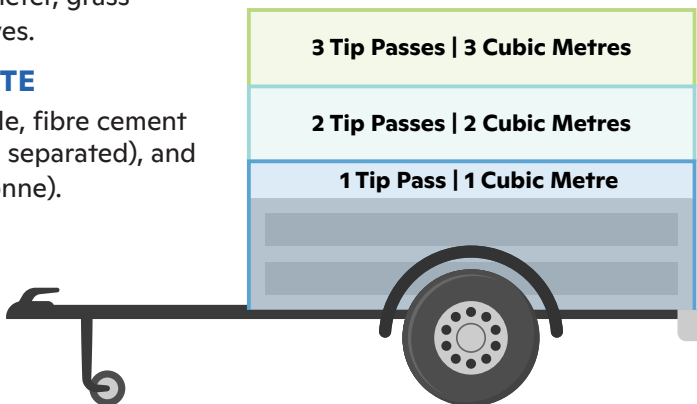
BUILDING WASTE

Timber, brick rubble, fibre cement and sand (must be separated), and asbestos (max 2 tonne).



MIXED WASTE

Broken items that cannot be reused, recycled, or composted.
