#### WHAT CAN YOU DO?

#### 1 Natural surveillance

- Are trees and shrubs trimmed to avoid being used as potential hiding places?
- If you have a fence at the front of your home, does it allow clear views?
- Do you have working sensor lights at the front of your house?

### 2 Access control

- Do you always lock your doors & windows, even when you are home?
- Are your bins secured so they cannot be used as a climbing aid?

### 3 Emphasising ownership

- Does your property have clearly defined boundaries?
- Is your house number visible from the street?
- Do you display signage that an alarm system is in use?

- Do you have a dog?
- Do you have a security alarm or CCTV?
- Do you have security screens on doors and windows?

- Avoid leaving a spare key outside your house. Leave your key with a trusted friend or neighbour or use a lockbox.
- Keep your car keys in a safe place out of sight and away from entry tables, doors and windows.
- Lock external doors when outside gardening and take the key with you.
