About this visual story

This visual story has been created to support people attending the Inclusive Communication community workshop on Wednesday 10 December at 10am to 12pm.

It explains what to expect during the workshop and helps people feel prepared and comfortable before attending.





Venue

The Inclusive Communication workshop will be at Lakelands Library and Community Centre.

The address is 49 Banksiadale Gate, Lakelands.

The workshop will be held in the meeting rooms.

When entering through the main doors of the library, the meeting rooms are on the right-hand side.



Who will be at the workshops

There may be support workers, family members, teachers, education assistants, community members, volunteers, and representatives from local groups and clubs.

Everyone is welcome to learn together.



What will happen in the workshops

A local Speech Pathologist will lead the workshop. There will be a PowerPoint presentation, group discussions, and activities.

People can take part in the way that feels best for them.



What will be discussed in the workshop

The workshop is about inclusive communication and how it helps everyone connect and take part.

It will focus on two tools that support people with disability, Visual Stories and Communication Boards.

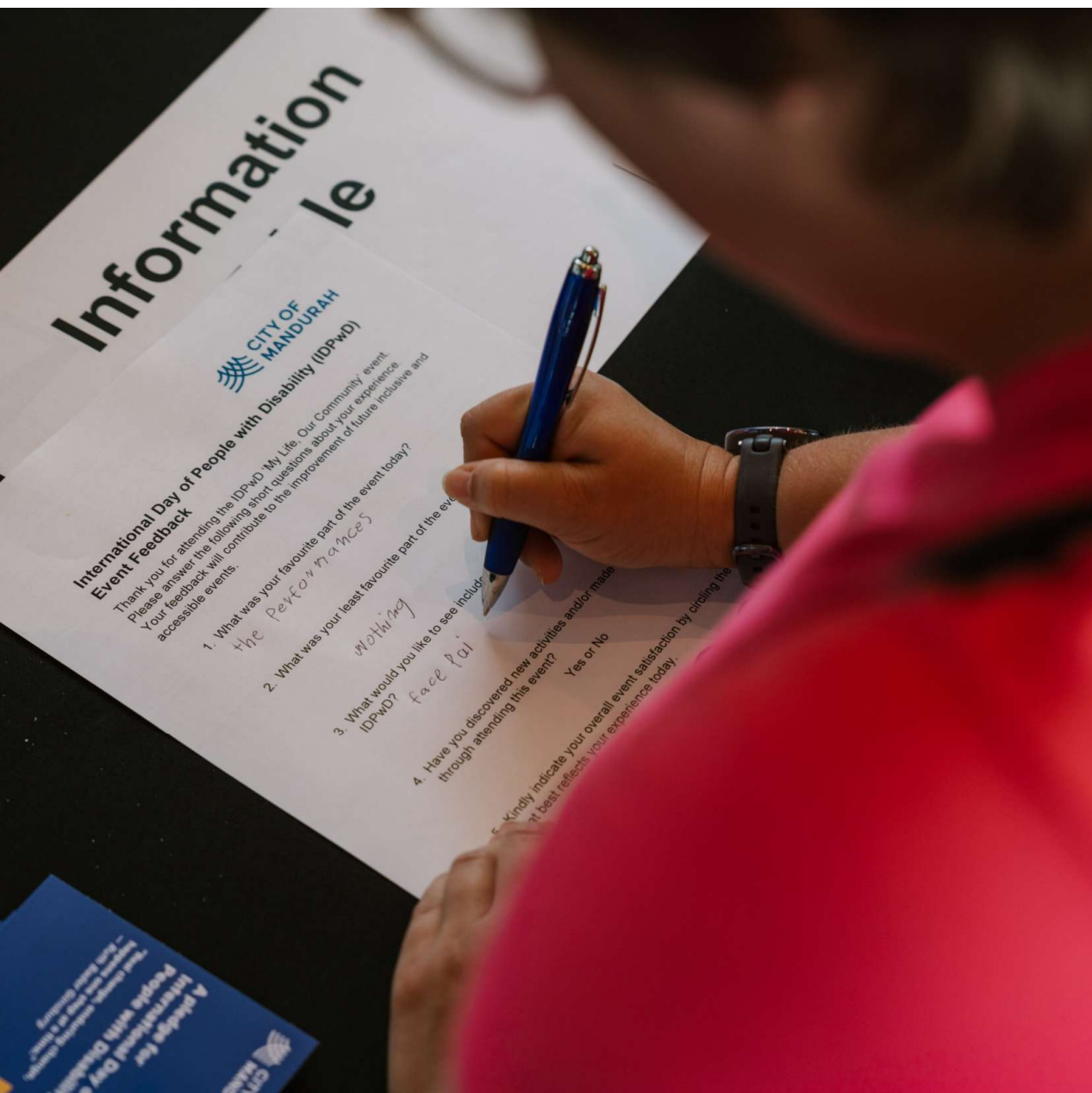
Attendees will learn how these tools make information easier to understand, help people prepare for new experiences, and support inclusion in everyday activities.



Looking ahead

The Inclusive Communication Workshop is a chance to learn practical ways to make communication easier and more inclusive for everyone.

Attendees will leave with ideas and tools they can use in everyday life to support people with disability and build more inclusive spaces.



Feedback form

At the end of the workshop, attendees will be invited to complete a short feedback form about their experience of the workshop.

Assistance will be available for anyone who would like support to complete the form.



Sensory supports

Sensory resources will be available for use during the workshop including fidget tools and mindful colouring.



Breakout spaces

There are quiet spaces in the library for anyone who needs a break from the workshop.

People can return to the workshop when they are ready.



Tea, coffee and snacks

Tea, coffee, water and light snacks like fruit and cake will be available at the workshop.



Toilets

The library has one accessible toilet and two other toilets.

Lakelands Shopping Centre is located next door which has an additional accessible toilet and other toilets.



Parking

There is a car park at the corner of Lake Valley Drive and Seppings Parade, and another in front of Lakelands Shopping Centre. Both car parks have ACROD parking bays.

ACROD bays are also available on Seppings Parade near the library entrance.



Public transport

There are bus stops near Lakelands Library on Mandurah Road and on Banksiadale Gate.
