The City of Mandurah is dedicated to fostering an accessible and inclusive community for people with disability. This guide outlines the facilities available at various beaches and connected open spaces spanning Mandurah's south, central, and north areas.

The provided information is designed to empower people with disability to plan their visits, ensuring beach days are stress-free and enjoyable.

Whether someone wants to swim, relax, enjoy the view, or have a picnic with friends, this resource assists in making informed choices about accessible beach options in the area.

- San Remo (Mandurah Surf Life Saving Club)
- Town Beach (Dolphin Drive)

Beach matting

Beach matting is installed at the following locations between November and April:

- Keith Holmes Reserve: Matting provided to the water and shade shelter.
- Orion Road: Approx 20m of matting, does not reach the water.
- Shayne Street (Doddi's Beach): Approx 15m of matting, does not reach the water and accessed from a grassed area.
- Town Beach (Off Dolphin Drive): Depending on tide, matting reaches close to the water.

A beach wheelchair and a beach walker are available to borrow for easier access on the sand (see pages 8–9 for details). Beach matting can shift over time, creating uneven or bumpy areas that may make it more difficult to manoeuvre a beach wheelchair. Visiting the site beforehand and having two people available to assist can help make navigation easier and safer.

Keith Holmes Reserve

- Track and Trail beach wheelchair
- Beach walker

The beach walker and Hippocampe are portable and can be taken to different locations. The Track and Trail is not to be dismantled. It is designed to stay assembled for easy access at Keith Holmes Reserve.

No booking is necessary. A Master Locksmiths Access Key (MLAK) is required to access this equipment. Loan keys are not available. Please note that beach wheelchairs are not to be taken away from the Eastern Foreshore.

Changing Places

Spend more time exploring Mandurah with access to Changing Places. Located next to the Mandurah Visitor Centre and on Mandurah's Eastern Foreshore, Changing Places facilities offer a secure, clean space for people with disability who need extra room and assistance to use the toilet when out and about.

Changing Places feature a ceiling hoist, adult-size change table and room for two support people.

How to access a Changing Places facility?

Changing Places facilities are unlocked using a Master Locksmiths Access Key (MLAK). The MLAK system helps people with disability access some locked public facilities, including Changing Places facilities and Liberty Swings. One MLAK key will work across many locations throughout Australia that use the MLAK system.

Keys can be purchased by completing the application form at masterlocksmiths.com.au/mlak/. A limited number of complimentary MLAK's are available by applying to the City of Mandurah. Email hcc@mandurah.wa.gov.au for more information.

Recreational Options at Beach Destinations

Mandurah's beaches offer a variety of activities, and below are some options based on recent reviews by local people with disability.

Falcon Bay Beach is a local favourite with a café conveniently located across the road. Enjoy the view, check out the play equipment, and consider staying for a barbeque. Access is made easy with pathways, accessible toilets and parking. Beach matting is not available at this location due to safety concerns arising from sand and tides.

Madora Bay Beach is a popular destination, featuring an accessible boardwalk viewing platform, accessible toilet, and a conveniently located park across the road—a perfect spot for quality time with family and friends.

San Remo Beach is an ideal location for a picnic with stunning ocean views from the viewing platform and lookout. It offers an accessible toilet, play equipment, and a cafe serving coffee and other treats during specific hours. It's also a place to borrow a beach wheelchair with limited beach matting for supported sand access—confirm availability with the Mandurah Surf Life Saving Club.

While exploring Mandurah's beaches, consider checking out the Estuary Pool on the **Eastern Foreshore**. It offers both ramp and stair access. The adjacent beach has a ramp, making it ideal for beach wheelchair access.
