The RAP Steering Group

The RAP steering group plays an important role guiding and supporting the City to shape, deliver and monitor the actions of the RAP.

For the RAP to be successful the Steering Group needs a broad representation from the Aboriginal community that vary in age, connection to community and life experiences.

The group will also include from the City of Mandurah: the Mayor, City Councillors and City officers.

Appointment of the committee will be for the duration of the new RAP (2-3 years).

What's involved?

- Sharing and listening to ideas while being part of discussions to create real solutions
- Meetings are held at the City of Mandurah every three months, or as needed
- Meetings include refreshments and a shared lunch.
- Occasional attendance at key events in Mandurah.
