


Visual Story Music Under the Bridge





About this visual story

This visual story has been created to support people attending Music Under the Bridge.

It explains what to expect during the event and helps people feel prepared and comfortable before attending.



Event information

Music Under the Bridge is a free performance that is part of the Mandurah Arts Festival.


The performance will be two hours of jazz music performed by West Australian Youth Jazz Orchestra. This company will be called WAYJO in the rest of this document.



Parking

ACROD parking will be available in the Western Foreshore car park. If you have an ACROD sticker, the parking attendants will allow you to park here.

Other parking is available on Hall Park. Parking may be busy and you might need to walk some distance to get to the seating area, so you should allow plenty of time to do this.



Public transport

You can take a bus to the Eastern Foreshore and cross the bridge to the event.




Location

The event will happen underneath the Mandurah Bridge, on the Western Foreshore.

There are lots of footpaths around this area, and a ramp will be installed near the skate park for wheelchair access to the area under the bridge.

Warm clothing is recommended because the event is outdoors.




What to bring

You will need to bring an outdoor chair, picnic blanket or something to sit on to be comfortable.

You should also bring something to keep you warm, and some mosquito repellent.

If you would like to eat or drink anything, you can bring this with you, or bring along some money to buy food from the food trucks at the event.




Food and drink

If you would like to eat or drink anything, you can bring this with you.

Alcohol is not allowed.

You can also buy food from the food trucks at the event. Sometimes the wait for food can take a while.



Arriving at the event

You don't need to buy a ticket and there is no reserved seating.

There may not be much space, so people might be sitting close to each other, or you might be seated far away from the stage.

You will still be able to hear the music even if you can't see the stage.




During the performance

Music Under the Bridge starts at 6.15pm. There will be some opening speeches, then WAYJO will start playing at 6.30pm.

There will be a short break in the middle of the performance, around 7.10pm.

The performance will finish around 8.30pm.


You can get up and move during the performance, use your phone and chat quietly with the people you are with.



Noise levels and taking breaks

The music will be playing quite loudly, and the audience might clap or cheer during the performance.

If you need to take a break, you can go to the Chill Out Zone, which will have noise-dampening headphones, beanbags and fidget toys.



At the end of the event


When the music finishes, you can pack up your belongings and leave.

Lots of people will be leaving at the same time. You might need to wait a while to leave the car park.



Toilets

There is a toilet block with Universal Access Toilets near the skate park, and more temporary toilets behind them.

If you need help while at Music Under the Bridge, you can visit the Information Tent.

Staff there will have a communication board.
