## What is a Social Story™?

A Social Story™ uses storytelling to explain new experiences and environments, helpful for people feeling nervous about attending a new place or event.

- Read the social story two weeks before the visit.
- If reading to someone, help them understand key points.
- After the visit, re-read the social story to celebrate achievements.



I am going to the Music under the Bridge event.

The event takes place on Saturday, 5 October 2024 and starts from 7pm.

At 7.30pm Perth Symphony Orchestra will perform.





This is a photo of the Mandurah Bridge.

The event will take place under the bridge and the surrounding area.

There are pathways at the Western Foreshore.

There is some soft sand under the bridge, that might be hard to walk on. There will be space to sit near the paths for people who find it difficult to walk on the sand.





I may walk to the event from the Eastern Foreshore across the bridge.

I may travel to the event by bus. Bus stops are close by at Mary Street before Leighton Place.

I may travel by car, there is parking available on the grassed area at Hall park.

There are ACROD bays available in the Mandurah Bridge car park.





If it gets too noisy, I may choose to wear noise reduction earmuffs.

I can wear my own, or I can go to the Chill Out Zone and use some there.





There will be food and drinks available to purchase from food trucks, which will be located next to the bridge.





These are a couple of things I could bring:

- Mosquito repellent
- Chair or picnic blanket

I can bring my own food and drinks to the event. There is no alcohol permitted at this event.







There will be temporary toilets and existing toilets on the grounds.

There are two universal access toilets available.
