Stained Glass Window**Artist: Cottage Leadlighting (1998)**

The Wagyl, or Rainbow Serpent, controls the balance of water, guards the sacred landscapes and is shown surrounded by Mandurah's aquatic flora and fauna.

Mast & Yardarm**Artist: Ray Miller & Volunteers (1999)**

Created by a wooden boat master craftsman, and made of laminated Oregon pine this piece carries the Australian, Aboriginal and Western Australian flags.

The Cluster**Artist: Gary Aitken (2005)**

This interesting series of interactive aluminium sculptures encourages visitors to interact by framing their view, capturing wishes and telling secrets.

**Connection****Artist: Bridget Norton (2009)**

Honouring the spirit of the site's traditional owners and the Osprey these totems acknowledge the significance of the site as an ancient meeting place.

Water Girl**Artist: Coral Lowry (2009)**

This large and elevated sculptural work depicts a little girl with her hair flying, joyfully playing in the waves.

**Water Boy****Artist: Coral Lowry (2009)**

The 'brother' of Water Girl, this large sculpture shows a young boy standing in the ocean and pointing at something in the distance.

Venetian Gondola**Artist: Lesley King (2008)**

This contemporary sculptural piece has been inspired by the gondolas of Venice and pays tribute to Mandurah's own canals.

**Venetian Dome****Artist: Lesley King (2008)**

This large tile mosaic dome has been carefully created by hand and features Venetian imagery.

The Gull**Artist: Carl MacMillan (2008)**

This fantasy, open decked, planked dinghy style boat with its port rail lower than the starboard side creates the impression of being beached.

**Adrift II****Artist: Carl MacMillan (2002)**

This impressive aluminium sculpture depicts a rowing boat adrift on a stormy ocean with large fish swimming underneath.

**Adrift I****Artist: Carl MacMillan (2002)**

This follows Adrift II and presents the boat in a calm sea offering a different perspective to the viewer.

**Steel Sculpture****Artist: Unknown (1990)**

Donated to the City of Mandurah this modern sculpture in steel soars skywards to create a dramatic spectacle.

**All in This Together****Artist: Carol Nicolson (2008)**

This surreal piece features ceramic hand-made tiled fish with human heads spiralling around an abandoned storm water pipe.

**Mandjar Gates****Artist: Coral Lowry (1996/97)**

These playful and intricate aluminium gates have been designed to create a fun and interesting entry point to Mandjar Square.

**Should You Pass Through the Sea I Will Be With You****Artist: Gary Aitken (2006)**

This sculpture commemorates a 1959 tragedy when a boat carrying six Perth nuns over turned and only two survived.
