

Dog exercise areas

Dogs and their owners are happier and healthier when they have regular exercise.

The City of Mandurah allows responsible dog exercise off-lead on over 17kms of coastline, as well as 26 reserves throughout Mandurah.

Regular exercise in these areas will help to:

Improve

- ✓ socialisation of your dog
- ✓ health of your dog
- ✓ sense of community for dog owner
- ✓ exercise for dog owner

Reduce

- ✓ dog barking and boredom
- ✓ destructive and aggressive behaviour

Dog exercise areas

Regularly exercising and training your dog helps reduce boredom, barking, digging, aggressive behaviour and increases sociability. The City of Mandurah offer a variety of dog exercise areas to encourage dog owners to exercise their pets more often.

Beaches

Where dogs may be exercised

The beach area from:

- (a) The northern boundary of the district to Avoca Place, Madora Bay
- (b) Southern end of Parmelia Way, Madora Bay south to Ajax Place, San Remo
- (c) Acheron Street south to beach access path located adjacent to 36 Ronsard Drive, San Remo
- (d) Southern beach access pathway of the car park located at the intersection of Ronsard Drive/Watersun Drive south to Petina Court, San Remo
- (e) Wade Street to Priam Road, Silver Sands
- (f) The western end of the groyne at the Peel Inlet entrance which forms part of Reserve 31499 west to the north eastern end of Janis Street, Halls Head
- (g) Sharland Street south west to Valley Road, Halls Head
- (h) Beach access pathway adjacent to 44 Halls Head Parade southerly to the beach access pathway between 21 and 25 Caravel Way, Halls Head
- (i) Beach access pathway to north west of Calypso Beach toilet block south to Gretel Drive, Falcon
- (j) Rowena Street south to north end of Mercedes Avenue, Falcon
- (k) Western end of Falcon Bay carpark south to Yeedong Road Boat Ramp, Falcon
- (l) Pedestrian beach access track off Westview Parade car park southerly to Dawesville Cut, Wannanup
- (m) South west of Pyramids Beach carpark to northern end of Hunter Street carpark, Florida
- (n) Beach access path opposite 8 and 9 Florida Parade south to Edwards Street, Melros
- (o) Beach access path adjacent to 18 Oceanic Drive Melros south to the southern boundary of the district

Where dogs are prohibited

The beach area from:

- (a) Avoca Place south to Madora Beach Road, Madora Bay
- (b) Ajax Place south to Acheron Road, San Remo
- (c) Petina Court south to Wade Street, San Remo
- (d) Adonis Road south to Henson Street, Silver Sands
- (e) Henson Street in west to the sea wall
- (f) Janis Street south to Sharland Street, Halls Head
- (g) Valley Road to beach access adjacent to 44 Halls Head Parade, Halls Head
- (h) North end of Mercedes Avenue west to Panamuna Drive, Falcon
- (i) Avalon Beach, Yeedong Road boat ramp south to Burna Street, Falcon
- (j) Pedestrian access track off Reserve 46606 (Westview Parade carpark) north east to the pedestrian access track from Avalon Parade, Wannanup
- (k) North end of Hunter Street carpark south to beach access opposite 8 and 9 Florida Parade
- (l) North end of Melros Beach carpark south to the beach access path adjacent to 18 Oceanic Drive, Melros

Control requirements in dog exercise areas

- Collar, tag, lead and poo bag on hand at all times
- Dog owners to maintain control at all times
- Socialise dogs before removing lead
- Dangerous dogs and restricted breeds to be on lead and muzzled as per Dog Act
- Report dog attacks and wandering dogs to Rangers

General information

- Failure to comply with the Dog Act 1976 may result in penalties of \$200 or more
- Areas that have no sign stating whether exercise or prohibited area then dogs are required to be on a lead at all times
- All dogs over three months old are to be microchipped and registered with your Local Council

Pick up after your dog

It is an offence if you do not clean up after your dog in any public place or on private property without the consent of the occupiers

- Free Poo bags are provided by the City of Mandurah near bins at many locations throughout the district.
- Tying a bag to your lead ensures you are always able to clean up responsibly after your dog

San Remo	Corner of Karinga Road and Guillardon Terrace
Meadow Springs	Oakmont Avenue, near Portrush Parade*
Silver Sands	Mandurah Terrace, Orion Road to Adonis Road
Mandurah Ocean Marina	Vivaldi Drive
Mandurah	Rushton Park North , Dower Street
Dudley Park	Corner Rigel Road, Cygni Street and Adana Street Corner of Balranald Road, Manildra Drive and Mandurah Road Corner of Mandurah Road, Leslie Street and Waterside Drive Waterside Drive, beginning 50m north of Barbecues
Coodanup	Peel Parade, Beacham Street and William Street
Greenfields	Koolyanga Road Amazon Drive Bortolo Oval, Bortolo Drive*
Halls Head	Joseph Cooper Reserve, Mary Street Janis Street Reserve corner of Clipper Way and McLarty Road Corner of Calypso Street and McLarty Road Peelwood Oval South, Mahogany Drive* Hall Park corner of Mary Street and Leighton Place* excludes War Memorial
Falcon	Merlin Oval, Merlin Street* Falcon Oval Lynda Street* Dampier Avenue
Wannanup	Corner of Baloo Crescent and Beachview Court
Dawesville	Wilderness Drive, Estuary Road Foreshore Reserve, north end to Iluka Road, recommencing Loton Street to Warrungup Springs

Where dogs are prohibited

Mandurah	Rushton Park, main oval Caterpillar Park playground enclosure corner of Park Road, Milgar Street and Reserve Drive
Coodanup	Bird Sanctuary, south east of John Street then in a north west direction to William Street
Halls Head	Peelwood Oval (main stadium), Peelwood Parade
Lakelands	Yindana Lake Reserve, corner of Yindana Boulevard and Nullewa Parkway

* Exercise off-lead permitted unless sporting activity underway

** Dogs prohibited from playground at any of the above locations
