Skating in Mandurah





About this visual story

This visual story has been created to support people visiting Skating in Mandurah.

It explains what to expect during a visit and helps people feel prepared and comfortable before attending.



Event information

Skating in Mandurah takes place during the July school holidays on the Eastern Foreshore from 3 July to 19 July.

The ice rink opens daily from 9am (except 3 July which is 12pm). Each session runs for 45 minutes.

Sensory sessions

Sensory-friendly sessions are available on 7, 8, 13 and 14 July at 9am.

These sessions are quieter, with fewer people (maximum 70), softer music, lower lighting and a calmer environment.

A communication board will be available, and Hidden Disabilities Sunflower lanyards and noise reduction earmuffs can be borrowed during the session.

Colouring activities will also be available.



Parking

ACROD and standard parking bays are available along Mandurah Terrace.

Parking may be busy during peak times.

More parking is available nearby on Sholl Street (near Mewburn Centre), Hackett Street and Corner of Gibson and Sutton Streets.



Public transport

There are bus stops close to the Eastern Foreshore.

Skating in Mandurah location

The ice rink is located outdoors on the Eastern Foreshore.

The skating rink is fully enclosed with fencing and has a ramp for wheelchair access.

Warm clothing is recommended. Helmets are available for people who would like to wear one while skating. Helmets are compulsory for children under 10 years of age.



Ticket pricing

Tickets can be purchased online or at the gate. Online tickets are available at a lower price.

There are different prices for adults, children and families. Kanga skating aids and socks are also available for an extra cost.

Children under 7 must have an adult with them on the ice. All tickets include booking fees.

Arriving at the ice rink area

Tickets are checked at the entry desk and skates are fitted at the skate fitting area.

Arriving 20 minutes before the session allows time to check in, have skates fitted and get ready.

Socks must be worn with skates. Socks can be purchased at the venue if needed.



During the skating session

Each skating session runs for 45 minutes.

An announcement will let everyone know when the session is starting and when it is finishing.

Kanga skating aids are available to help people who need extra balance and support on the ice.



Wheelchair access

People using a wheelchair can enter the rink using a ramp.

A support person, family member or friend may go on the ice to assist if required.



Noise levels and taking breaks

Noise levels may vary depending on the session.

People can take a break or stop skating at any time if needed. There are spaces to sit and watch.

Sensory-friendly sessions are quieter, with fewer people, softer music and minimal announcements.



At the end of the session

Skates are returned to the skate fitting area and shoes are put back on.



After the session

After skating, people may choose to have something to eat or drink at nearby food outlets or sit and relax in the seating areas at the ice rink.



Other activities

A variety of activities are available near the skating rink for visitors to explore. Some are free, and others have a cost.



Toilets

General and universally accessible toilets are located near the ice rink.

A Changing Places facility with adult change table and hoist is also available. An MLAK key is required to access this facility.
