About this visual story

This visual story has been created to support people attending *The Game*.

It explains what to expect during the event and helps people feel prepared and comfortable before attending.



Event information

The Game is a one-hour dance-theatre performance that is part of the Mandurah Arts Festival.

The show will be about women's football, equality and the community that women's sport creates.

The performers will use dance, theatre and football movements to tell the story.

The show is being held at Mandurah Aquatic and Recreation Centre, also called the MARC.



Parking

Accessible parking and ACROD parking are available at the MARC.

Parking might be busy. You should allow plenty of time to find a parking space and walk to the Events entrance.



Public transport

You can take a bus to the MARC or you can take a bus to the Forum, which is opposite the MARC.

Location

The MARC is a large recreation centre with swimming pools, sports courts and other facilities.

The building has accessible ramps, toilets and ACROD parking.

The show will be held in Show Court 1. You will need to come in through the Events Entrance, which might be different to where you normally enter the MARC for classes or for the pool.



Location

There will be signs to show you to the right part of the building.

Staff can also help you if you are not sure.



What to bring

You will need to bring your ticket with you. You can have your ticket on your phone or bring a printed copy.

You might also like to bring a water bottle and anything else you need to feel comfortable during the performance.

If you are sensitive to loud sounds, you may want to bring headphones or earplugs.



During the performance

The performers will use dance, theatre and football movements to tell the story.

There will be music and other sounds during the performance, and some parts may be loud.

The audience may clap, cheer or make other noises during the performance.

You can watch quietly, clap or respond to the performers if you would like to.



Noise levels and taking breaks

If you need a break, you can leave the Show Court and wait in the foyer until you are ready.

You can bring headphones or earplugs if they help you feel comfortable.



At the end of the event

When the performance finishes, you can leave Show Court 1 and exit through the same door you came in through.

Lots of people will be leaving at the same time. You might need to wait a while to leave the car park.
