About this visual story

This visual story has been created to support people attending the Disability Access and Inclusion Plan (DAIP) launch event.

It explains what to expect and helps people feel prepared and comfortable before attending the drop-in session.



What is a Disability Access and Inclusion Plan

A DAIP is a five-year plan that helps the City of Mandurah make the community more accessible and inclusive for people with disability.

It is required under the Disability Services Act 1993 (WA) and it explains how the City will work to improve access and inclusion for people with disability in Mandurah.



Date, time and venue

The launch event will be held on Friday 11 September from 4pm to 5.30pm at the Mandurah Performing Arts Centre.

About the launch event

The City of Mandurah is holding an event to launch the new DAIP 2026–2031.

The event will recognise the contribution of people with disability and community members who helped shape the Plan.

There will be information about the new Plan and an opportunity to connect with other community members.



Arriving at the event

The event will be held in the foyer at the Mandurah Performing Arts Centre.

When you arrive, City of Mandurah employees will be there to welcome guests and help you sign in.

Seating will be available, including spaces for people who use wheelchairs.



What will happen at the launch event

Before the event starts, you can:

- Explore the new Plan
- Chat with City staff
- Have some fun in the photo booth

You can choose to join in any of these activities.

At 4.30pm, the official launch will begin with:

- A Welcome to Country
- A speech from the Mayor
- A short film featuring local people with disability

An Auslan interpreter will be available during the speeches and film to support communication and accessibility.



Afternoon Tea

Complimentary afternoon tea will be available throughout the event to help celebrate the launch of the new Plan.

There will be sandwiches, cake and fruit, with tea, coffee and water available.



Who will be at the launch event

There will be people with disability, families, community members, City of Mandurah employees, Elected Members and Access and Inclusion Advisory Group members at the event.

There will also be people from local disability, community and support organisations.



Sensory supports

A Chill Out Zone will be available for anyone who would like some time away from the event.

The space will have bean bags, fidget resources and noise-reduction earmuffs to borrow.

The Chill Out Zone will be located behind the stairs in the foyer.



Toilets

Toilets are available from the main foyer, including male and female toilets and a Universal Access Toilet.

The Universal Access Toilet is located in the toilet block closest to the Stage Door restaurant.

Changing Places

A Changing Places facility is located near the venue, next to the Mandurah Visitor Centre.

People need to bring their own MLAK key to access the facility.

The Changing Places facility has an adult change table, ceiling hoist, accessible toilet and shower
